Dear Splendido Residents,

The recent announcement from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to lift mask-wearing guidelines for fully vaccinated people is good news, but it has generated lots of questions around the circumstances when you should wear a mask even if you are fully vaccinated. Note that "fully vaccinated" means two weeks after receiving the second injection of a two-dose vaccine, or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine.

Below are our community's new protocols for mask-wearing. Fully vaccinated residents are not required to wear a mask inside Splendido or anywhere on Splendido's grounds, except for the instances below. While it is the resident's choice to whether or not to wear a mask within the community, we encourage residents to wear a mask when out and about.

## Where Residents Are Required to Wear Masks

In/On **Mather transportation** (sedan and bus)

While working out in **Get Fit** and in all indoor exercise classes (except in the pool)

In the **restaurants**, while when not eating or drinking and when staff are present.

In the **salon** for any service

When meeting with staff in their offices. All staff will continue to wear their masks at all times.

## **VISITORS TO SONORA:**

Visitors must wear masks to enter Sonora, though they can remove their masks once in the privacy of a resident's room, if they prefer.

## MASKS REQUIRED FOR VISITORS, CAREGIVERS & OTHERS:

All visitors, caregivers, contractors, and prospective residents must wear masks while in the indoor amenity areas, regardless of vaccination status. Note that amenity areas are for residents only; indoor visits should take place in residents' homes. Additionally, all Mather employees, regardless of vaccination status, are required to wear a mask.

We will continue to monitor the CDC and local and state health department guidance and keep you informed.
