COVID-19 UPDATE

January 15, 2022

Dear Employees of Splendido,

We wanted to inform you that we have learned that one resident in Independent Living, along with two employees in Sonora and one Sonora resident have tested positive for COVID-19. Note that this is our first time reporting these cases; these have not been reported in a previous letter. We wish these individuals a speedy recovery.

Splendido is interviewing these individuals to determine if they were in close contact with residents and/or other employees (meaning within 6 feet of anyone for more than 15 minutes).

COVID-19 positivity rates have climbed substantially including locally in Pima County. We continue to implement infection control measures and stress the importance of hand washing, wearing a properly fitting mask, and keeping distance from others where possible.

SONORA UPDATES:

Due to these positive cases in Sonora, we will continue with outbreak protocols, which include testing of **Sonora residents and employees** twice a week until there are no more positive cases for 14 days. During this time, residents may have visitors in their suites and masks must be worn at all times.

STAY HOME IF YOU ARE ILL:

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the **Omicron** variant of COVID-19 appears to be much more contagious than the Delta variant, and even vaccinated people can spread it. If you have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, or if you have symptoms—even mild, cold-like symptoms—please stay home.

MONITOR FOR COVID-19 SYMPTOMS:

With COVID-19 symptoms surging in our area, it's important to monitor yourself for symptoms of COVID-19, which includes a loss of taste or smell, cough, fever, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, shortness of breath, pink eye, eye pain, vertigo, and gastrointestinal issues such as diarrhea, nausea, or vomiting.

If you are experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19, or if you have tested positive, please reach out to your HR representative.
